

#### Why word stress is important?

Mistakes in word stress are a common cause of misunderstanding in English. Here are the reasons why:

Stressing the wrong syllable in a word can make the word very difficult to hear and understand; for example, try saying the following words:

Stressing a word differently can change the meaning or type of the word

#### What word stress is

When we stress syllables in words, we use a combination of different features. Experiment now with the word 'computer'. Say it out loud. Listen to yourself. The second syllable of the three is stressed.

## A stressed syllable combines five features:

- 1) It is l-o-n-g-e-r com p-u-ter
- 2) It is LOUDER comPUTer
- 3) It has a change in pitch from the syllables coming before and afterwards. The pitch of a stressed syllable is usually higher.
- 4) It is said more clearly -The vowel sound is purer. Compare the first and last vowel sounds with the stressed sound.
- 5) It uses larger facial movements Look in the mirror when you say the word. Look at your jaw and lips in particular.

Stress is emphasis given to certain syllables in words. In English, stress is produced with a longer, louder and higher pitched sound than unstressed sounds.

#### Some 'rules' of word stress

There are patterns in word stress in English but, as a rule (!), it is dangerous to say there are fixed rules. Exceptions can usually be found.

Here are some general tendencies for word stress in English:

Word	Type of word	Tendency	Exceptions
apple table happy	two-syllable nouns and adjectives	stress on the first syllable O o apple	hotel lagoon
hairbrush football	compound nouns	fairly equally balanced but with stronger stress on the first part O o hairbrush

STRESS () is on the 01st syllable




eg. Teacher; Actor; English;

C. Adjectives:

STRESS () is on the 01st syllable



eg. 'Happy; 'Muggy; 'Hangry; 'Stupid

**© WORDS OF TWO (2) SYLLABLES** 

C. Adverbs:

STRESS () is on the 01st syllable



WORDS OF TWO (2) SYLLABLES THE
STRESS ON THE O1st SYLLABLE
EXCEPT VERBS ON THE O2nd SYLLABLE.
