Why do we study phonetics?


 To be able to understand the speech of other speakers and to be understood as well.









Final "ed"


 In words that end in –ted or –ded it is pronounced as "id"



Final "ed"


Voiceless sound + ed= /t/

Voiceless sounds: "p", "k", "f", "ch", "sh", "gh", "s"



Final "ed"

- Voiced sound+ ed= /d/
- Voiced sounds use the vocal cords and produce a vibration in the throat
