I was sitting on a train once when I noticed this mobile phone on the floor. I looked around but I couldn't see anyone nearby who could have dropped it.

Curious to see who might have dropped it, I scrolled through the address book and opened a text message but it was in a language I couldn't understand. Let's break down the text using the questions "who," "what," "when," "where," "why," and "how":

#### 1. Who?

The narrator (the person telling the story) and eventually, a woman who turns out to be the owner of the phone.

#### 2. What?

The narrator finds a phone on the floor of the train, sends a message to the contacts in the phone, and later meets the owner, who becomes his wife.

### 3. When?

The events happen while the narrator is sitting on a train, with specific moments like when the phone is found, when messages are sent, and when the owner calls right before the narrator gets off the train.

#### 4. Where?

The main setting is a train, and later, a station café where the narrator waits to meet the owner of the phone.

## 5. Why?

The narrator picks up the phone out of curiosity and a desire to return it to its owner, leading to the eventual meeting with the woman who owns it.

# 6. How?

The narrator takes action by scrolling through the phone's contacts, sending messages to a few names in the address book, and communicating with the owner via phone call. Eventually, they meet at the station café, leading to the start of a relationship.
