FUTURE SIMPLE TENSE

What is the FUTURE simple?

There is **NO** FUTURE TENSE in English.
Instead, English has several forms that
can refer to the future



USE OF THE FUTURE TENSE

use

1. The present simple :

for something scheduled

- 1) We **have** a lesson online next Saturday. (**to have**)
- 2) The train **arrives** at 6.30 in the morning. (**to arrive**)
- 3) The holidays **start** next week. (**to start**)
- 4) It **is** my birthday tomorrow. (**to be**)
- 5) our trips **are** next spring (**to be**)

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USE OF THE FUTURE TENSE

use

2. Present continuous

To be (present) + verb + ing

for plans or arrangements

- 1) I **am playing** football tomorrow. (**play**)
- 2) They **are coming** to see us tomorrow. (**come**)
- 3) We **are having** a party at night. (**have**)
- 4) He **is traveling** by plane next week. (**travel**)
- 5) She **is having** her hair cut tomorrow. (**have**)



Usually refers to the near future

USE OF THE FUTURE TENSE

use

3. We use “ will ”

Will + verb without (to)

when we express general predictions or beliefs

when we make a quick decision

when we make offers and promises

1) *There is the phone! I **will get** it (to get)*

2) *Give me a call. we **will go** out for coffee (to go)*

1) *I **will see** you tomorrow. (to see)*

2) *We **will send** you an email. (to send)*



1) *It **will be** a nice day tomorrow. (to be)*

2) *I think Brazil **will win** the World Cup. (to win)*



THE FUTURE SIMPLE

USE OF THE FUTURE TENSE

use

4. We use “Be going to “:

To be (present) Going to + verb without (to)

To talk about plans or intentions:

To make predictions based on evidence

1) Look at those black clouds. I think it **is going to rain**.
(to rain)

1) Our strikers **are going to run** 11km/match. (to run)



- 1) I **am going to drive** to work today. (to drive)
- 2) They **are going to move** to Algiers. (to move)



Some Famous verbs

TO BE	positive	negative
I/you/we/they	will be	will not be
he/she/it	will be	will not be

TO HAVE	positive	negative
I/you/we/they	will have	will not have
he/she/it	Will have	Will not have

TO DO	positive	negative
I/you/we/they	will do	will not do
he/she/it	Will do	Will not do

Will not = won't
